YOUTH SERVICES 2016 - 2017

E

ach year presents new possibilities to build community and we strive to offer programs that bring our community together in different, exciting ways. We collaborated with Westerly Library this year with ONE FAMILY – ONE BOOK and chose Roald Dahl's James and the Giant Peach. We offered read alouds at the libraries and also in our afterschool Outreach programs at both Deans Mill and West Vine Street schools. The United Theatre hosted a screening of the movie as a final celebration, along with themed treats provided by Wakin' Up Waggin'. All the children attending received their own copy of a Roald Dahl book. The

project was made possible through the generosity of Deborah and Chuck Royce, along with the community minded spirit of Simon Holt of the United Theatre. Our gratitude is boundless.

The combined Youth Services (children and teens) offered 316 programs this past year with 7,247 people in attendance. We constantly fine tune our offerings, adding new opportunities and refining others to appeal to our patrons. We will experiment with some new times in the upcoming year, which will be possible with our new hours beginning in August.

A Summer Reading Program grant from a family foundation again enabled us to bring programming to summer camps in our community, along with free books for the campers to bring home. We were also fortunate to receive a Summer Reading Sponsorship from McQuade's Marketplace which was very helpful. We include in this report a list of supporters; we rely on their generosity to make our programs happen. We are pleased to report higher reading rates among our 670 readers this summer, with participation rates between 78% - 84% for all age groups. This is very significant, as the barometer for deeming a reading program successful is in the 33% range. Nice job and congratulations to all our summer readers!

Our Read and Feed Collaboration with the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center enjoyed another successful summer. The children helped others in our community by donating over 520 canned and dry goods to the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center.

Our annual Children's Opera found a new date during our Summer Reading Program and although attendance was low this year, we are working on possible remedies. Our thanks go out again to our generous opera benefactor.




ANNUAL BUDGET

F

or the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, the Stonington Free Library received a total of \$593,228 in income, an increase of 5% over the previous year. Annual Appeal results were in line with budget and consistent with the prior year. Municipal funding was essentially flat, while higher draws on the Library's endowment funds coupled with the receipt of restricted grants for capital purposes accounted for the growth in income.


* Reflects contributions that are restricted by the donor for future capital spending for specific purposes, and thus not available to fund ongoing operating expenses.

Uses of funds for the 16/17 fiscal year consisted of \$556,084 in operating expenses (before depreciation) plus \$34,415 in capital spending, for a total of \$590,499.


TOTAL SPENDING CAN BE BROKEN DOWN AS FOLLOWS:

As we heard loud and clear from survey responses and focus groups, at the Stonington Free Library our staff is truly our greatest asset! And as shown in the table above, personnel costs form the majority of the Library's annual spending. Operating costs for the 2016/17 fiscal year grew by 3.7% over the previous year due primarily to the implementation of long-deferred wage adjustments along with increased benefit costs. Despite this year over year increase, however, operating expenses came in approximately \$20,000 lower than budget for the year.

ANNUAL CIRCULATION AND PROGRAMMING

OUTREACH AND COLLABORATION

Expanding our reach beyond our physical walls and collaborating with other organizations has been our focus this past year and will continue in the years to come. Several new outreach initiatives have been launched and all have been met with much excitement, enthusiasm and participation.

One new outreach effort is a branch at the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center, which started the end of January. Our PNC branch is open two Wednesdays a month from 10 to 11:30 and is staffed by our volunteer librarians. As of the end of June it has served 81 people who checked out 115 items. We plan to add additional dates and times to the branch this Fall.

We are also collaborating with Masonicare at Mystic to provide outreach programs to its residents. Masonicare residents enjoy a monthly book group, which is facilitated by a Library staff member. The Library also provides copies of the monthly book group selection. Additionally, Masonicare provides transportation to its residents for a monthly visit to the Library.


Yet another initiative is the revival of a round table gathering of all the non-profit organizations in the Town of Stonington. The purpose of this group is to share information, pool resources and to promote collaboration. There are currently 27 organizations actively participating in the round table gatherings.



Don't forget to check out the Little Free Libraries at Mathews Park and Stonington Point. They were installed in July through a collaboration between the Library, the Stonington Village Improvement Association (SVIA) and Stonington High School. The project was funded by the SVIA. The Stonington High School shop class, led by Stephen Beale, constructed the libraries. Library volunteers will keep them well stocked with books.

And when you visit the Library enjoy our expanded new book area and reading corner and use one of our new laptops – all thanks to the generous response to the Giving Tree at our Mystery Dinner.

CIRCULATION AND ADULT PROGRAMMING



While our overall circulation of physical materials is down slightly from last year, our digital material circulation, number of programs, program attendance and new initiatives increased significantly. The Library's eReader lending program continues to be successful with a 61% increase in circulation over last year. eBook and eAudiobook checkouts grew 59% over the previous year. In total our 3,525 active card holders borrowed 51,006 materials.

Thanks to the generosity of a Library supporter, we are now able to keep an accurate count of annual visits through the funding and installation of a door counter last May. We are happy to report that 69,107 people stepped through our doors this past year. As always, our friendly and knowledgeable librarians provided a warm welcome to all who stopped in!

We continue to increase the number of adult programs we offer. Adults enjoyed 13 more programs this year for a total of 47, which drew 1,278 participants. Part of this increase is due to a new and well attended monthly book group. The group began in January and meets the second Thursday of the month at 2 pm at the Library.

Our adult summer reading program was met with enthusiastic participation. Our weekly and grand prize drawings received 218 entries. 21 winners were chosen over the summer to choose from a variety of prizes in our display, while one lucky grand prize winner received a Kindle Fire.

This coming year we will continue to expand our outreach, collaboration and programming initiatives. We will offer extended week night hours beginning the end of August, which was the top request from our community survey and focus groups last summer. Yet another community request nearing completion is a brand new website set to launch by the end of August. As always, we will continue to respond to the community's feedback, interests and needs. Let us know how we are doing and we hope to see you soon!
