As all our patrons know, as do our many visitors, our beloved Stonington Free Library is beautiful but also small – our space challenges are constant and real. As many of you also know, we have plans in the works to refurbish and repurpose our space in such a way as to add 575 square feet of useable space. An addition, which will make the Library accessible to all, will add a further 700 square feet. There has been great progress in moving these plans forward over the past year thanks to the diligent and unrelenting hard work on the part of the Building Committee.

However, there is another sense in which libraries, whatever their size, and they come in all sizes and shapes, have no walls. The new digital world makes it possible for any library to extend its reach and to be accessible to its patrons at any hour on any day. The only limitations are those imposed by a failure of imagination. Also, in a very beautiful sense, a library is in itself a world without walls. FROM THE PRESIDENTS

Our Vision of Service and Growth; SFL is Poised for the Future

It's hard to believe that 12 months have passed since we assumed our roles as Co-Presidents, and what a whirlwind year it's been! As we write this letter, the Library is a hive of activity, including scores of Summer Readers in the Children's Library and preparations for another packed house for our Thoughtful Thursday and Sunday lecture series.

Stonington's hometown library is a dynamic, vibrant place. SFL's history of service and value to the lives of our residents is well-known and appreciated, and as the role of libraries has changed over time, SFL has continued to evolve and enhance its offerings to meet the needs of our community. Throughout this evolution, our mission remains constant: to enrich lives and build community by bringing information, ideas and people together.

As we reflect on the past year, we are happy to report that progress has been made on many fronts, and we ended the year stronger and busier than ever before. We welcomed over 70,000 visitors over the course of the year, and delighted the more than 9,000 people who attended Library programs. Cardholders and items checked out increased year over year, while our outreach programs continued to expand across Stonington through initiatives at the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center, Stonington Community Center, Stonington Schools, local retirement communities and more.

As we reflect on the past year, we are happy to report that progress has been made on many fronts, and we ended the year stronger and busier than ever before.

All of this activity was supported by our generous donors and our municipal partners. The number of donors contributing to our Annual Appeal increased this year, as did the total amount raised, successfully exceeding our budget goal. Additionally, our continued advocacy efforts with municipal funding authorities yielded increased financial commitments from the Town and Borough of Stonington, protecting our ability to maintain our opening hours.

The coming months are shaping up to be even more exciting as we lay the groundwork for a new addition on the east side of the existing building which will provide a handicap accessible entrance, elevator and two ADA bathrooms while also reclaiming critical new floor space and paving the way for an interior refurbishment within the existing building. We received a huge vote of confidence from the Town of Stonington with a total commitment of \$100,000 toward the new addition and a \$145,000 matching grant from the State of Connecticut to assist in the interior refurbishment.

We are poised for the future but our work isn't done yet! The dedicated staff and board of your Library want to thank you for a great year, and we look forward to our continued partnership. We hope to see you in the library soon.

INITIATIVES, OUTREACH AND PROGRAMMING

This past year the Library and its dedicated staff, board and volunteers have focused on advocacy, new fundraising initiatives and continuing to grow our programs, services and outreach initiatives.

Advocacy, Grants, Fundraising and Volunteers

We embarked on a significant advocacy campaign with the goal of increasing the annual municipal funding the Town distributes to the three libraries it supports. Due to our efforts the Board of Finance (BoF) created a Library Task Force made up of BoF members and representatives from SFL, Mystic & Noank Library and Westerly Library. The Task Force continues to look at the funding situations for all three libraries today, but we are pleased that they listened to our needs and gave us an additional \$15,000 for Fiscal Year 2020. The Borough also provided us with an additional \$1,000.

A significant grant opportunity with the CT State Library was pursued successfully. This \$145,000 matching grant will allow for an interior refurbishment project. We will update the community as this exciting project moves ahead in the coming year.

Many new fundraising initiatives came about this year. This past holiday season a Small Business Collaborative was spearheaded by members of the Library's Development Committee. An Italian Holiday Show during the annual Stroll benefited the Library thanks to the generosity of Tom Piacenza of Social Coffee Roastery and Italian singing sensation Gianpaolo Digrazia. A group of volunteers also held a Book and Bake Sale at the Stonington High School for the first annual town-wide Indoor Yard Sale & Market. Two new fundraising events to look forward to this summer are our Read & Raise Readathon and we will assume operation of the Stonington Village Fair Annual Book Sale.

All that we offer would not be possible without the support of our loyal and dedicated volunteers. This year 211 volunteers worked over 7,000 hours (an estimated value of \$180,000). We cannot thank each and every one of you enough for all that you do for both the Library and the community.

Outreach and Collaboration

Our branch at the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center is still open every Wednesday from 10 to 11:30am and is staffed by our volunteer librarians. This past year it served 235 people who checked out 371 items.

The Stonington Non-profit Roundtable, with current membership of 43 organizations, continues to meet and grow at the Library. The group's accomplishments this year include: a Volunteer Fair, the launch of a website (stoningtonnonprofits.org), a universal volunteer application for participating organizations, access to Grant Station at the Library and participation in Human Service's second annual Community Spring Fest.

The four Little Free Libraries (LFLs) in the Borough, a collaboration between the Stonington Village Improvement Association (SVIA) and the Library, were stocked with over 1,600 books.

Circulation and Adult Programming

This past year over 70,000 visitors stepped through our doors, our 3,487 active card holders borrowed 50,669 materials and 9,468 people attended 431 library programs. Library staff answered over 6,000 reference questions and there were over 6,000 sessions on our public computers and WiFi.

Adults enjoyed 133 programs, which drew 2,866 participants. We began offering One-on-One Tech Help sessions again this year on Friday afternoons. We also offered a special 3-week Introduction to Excel Class led by dedicated volunteer Sharon Sisitzky; look out for another 3-week session on PowerPoint this summer. Our weekly Knitting Group, monthly Book Group, outreach Book Groups at Masonicare and the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center are still going strong. Our inclusive program for adults with disabilities, SFL Nightclub, successfully ran again in the winter with the help of Deidre Tool, Community Classroom Coordinator and Transition Counselor at Stonington High School.

The J. D. McClatchy Memorial Corner in the Library Gallery was added this year. Visitors are welcome to browse and enjoy this unique collection, a gift of the estate of J. D. (Sandy) McClatchy (August 12th 1945-April 10th 2018). Library patron and Stonington resident Robert Palm most generously donated Sandy's typewriter. Along with the typewriter goes an invitation to browse the books from Sandy's library that are on the shelves and then write a poem of your own.

INITIATIVES, OUTREACH AND PROGRAMMING CONTINUED

New Digital Services

On Library Giving Day we received a generous offer from Sibby Lynch and Michael Schefers to fund a year's subscription to the Adobe Creative Cloud. This includes well-known programs for video, design, photography, and the web, such as Photoshop, InDesign, Illustrator, Premiere Pro, Acrobat and more.

We were finally able to work through our backlog of video editing thanks to Library Assistant Brian Walls. If you missed one of our Sunday Evening Lectures or Thoughtful Thursdays, there is a good chance it is now available to watch on both our website and YouTube channel. We invite you to join the 1,600 that have already viewed our recordings.

This coming year we will continue to move the building, refurbishment and fiber plans forward, keep the momentum of our advocacy campaign and continue to expand our services. We hope you will stop by soon whether it be to attend a program, check out an item, ask for tech help, use a computer/WiFi, or simply to read, relax, study, meet or work within the Library. Our friendly and welcoming staff are ready to offer a warm greeting and assist you with any question or need.

YOUTH SERVICES

Each year presents new possibilities to build community in Stonington and this year brought expanded Winter Reading Challenges to our patrons. Mr. and Mrs. Charles Royce generously supported all three Winter Reading Challenges and we are most grateful for their continuing commitment to literacy in our area. We continued Read BOLD, a collaboration between the Library and Stonington High School. The purpose behind Read BOLD was to build bridges between adults and youth in our community, helping adults understand teens and opening a dialogue between the two groups. This year's book was *The Hate U Give* by Angie Thomas and a discussion group was held for adults and teens at the end of the program, along with a viewing of the movie. Free copies of the book were available at both the High School and the Library. Everyone finishing the book was eligible for a prize drawing of a Kindle Fire tablet or gift card baskets made possible through donations from Sift Bakery, Bank Square Books and Mystic Luxury Cinemas. These local businesses are truly our partners in promoting literacy.

Our new Family Reading Challenge for elementary and middle school age children was very popular with 188 family members joining the challenge. We offered a list of 18 titles and the opportunity to enter a drawing for gift card baskets or a Kindle Fire tablet with each book read. Our Teen Advisory Board requested that we put together a similar list for older students in conjunction with our Summer Reading Program and we were happy to add something new and different this year.

YOUTH SERVICES CONTINUED

It was a poetry theme for 50 to Grow On, an early literacy challenge for our youngest patrons. We curated a list of 40 books and each family read ten books of their own choosing. We incorporated titles in our weekly Story Times and this year, we read some of the books on our YouTube channel. Parents appreciated the option of having their child see and hear a book being read if they were waiting somewhere and didn't have a book with them.

The Youth Services departments offered 298 programs for children and teens this year with over 6,600 attendees. A grant from a family foundation funded our ever popular Summer Reading Program and enabled us to bring programming to summer camps in our community, along with free books for the campers to bring home. We include in this report a list of our many generous supporters; we rely on them to make our programs happen. Nice job and congratulations to all our summer readers!

Our Read and Feed Collaboration with the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center enjoyed another successful summer. The children helped others in our community by donating over 500 canned and dry goods to the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center Food Pantry.

We also began attending the monthly Mobile Food Pantry held at the High School. We offered a supply of new or gently used books to give away and believe this builds the presence of the Library in the community. Food for the mind along with food for the body!

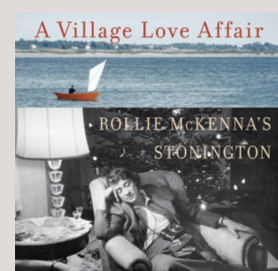

FINANCIAL REPORT

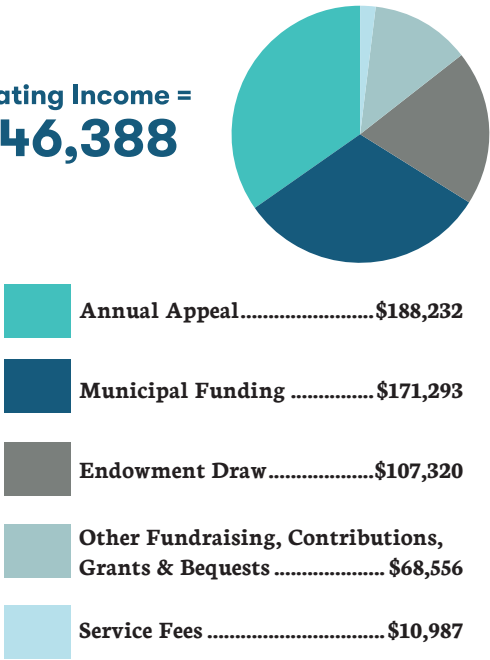
Preliminary Financial Results for the Year Ended
June 30, 2019 (unaudited)

Over the past fiscal year the Stonington Free Library recorded approximately \$546,400 in operating income. \$171,000 or 31% came from municipal funding including the Town and Borough of Stonington. Draws from the endowment amounted to \$107,000, providing just over 19% of the total, and the balance came from private donations.

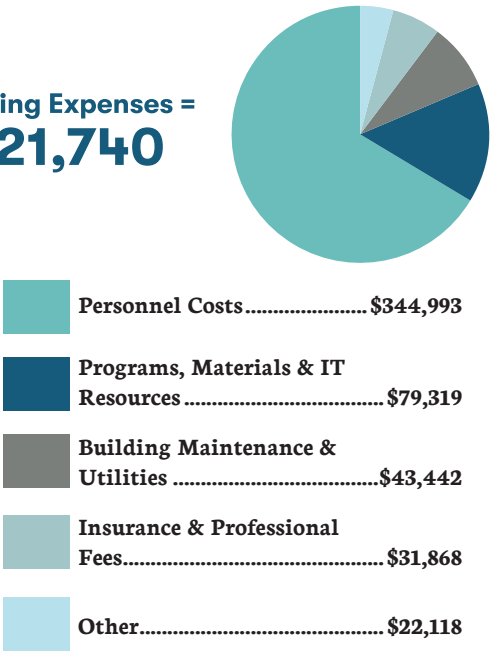
In total, operating income exceeded SFL’s budget for the year by \$2,700 or 0.5%, led by strong Annual Appeal results which exceeded budget by 4%. Other fundraising also experienced growth as a result of new development initiatives, the receipt of one-time restricted giving to preserve Friday opening hours and a generous number of memorial gifts. These increases more than offset lower draws from the endowment.

Operating expenses for the year totalled \$521,740 before depreciation, down slightly from the previous year and virtually in line with budget. As is typical, personnel costs accounted for the bulk of operating costs at just over 66%. Cardholder services, which include library programs, materials and digital resources, are the next largest category of expenses, comprising nearly \$80,000, or 15%. Operating income for the year amounted to \$24,648, slightly ahead of budget. Capital expenditures, which are not included in operating costs, amounted to an additional \$11,000 for the year, which were funded with operating income.
