
# THE E-LIBRARIAN


Adult Summer Library Challenge 2022: Oscar-Worthy Reads

# JUNETEENTH

Juneteenth is a celebration of the end of slavery in the United States. "On June 19, 1865, Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, TX, and announced the end of the Civil War and the end of slavery. Although the Emancipation Proclamation came 2½ years earlier on January 1, 1863, many enslavers continued to hold enslaved Black people captive after the announcement, so Juneteenth became a symbolic date representing African American freedom."


# Knitting in Nature
